This month's board meeting will be held at 5:00 pm at Gloucester Towne.

Financial updates & Board Action Items:

234 Essex Street -Phil Kuntz from PDK Architects inspected the property. After his inspection, he reported that the property was in terrible condition and that rehabbing the house would be far too expensive.

A conference call with Phil, Dennis Crawford, Lisa, and Sue was scheduled to discuss the options:

- Rehab the existing home
- Demolish and rebuild
- Demolish and discuss with HUD the possibility of donating or selling the land. If the property were sold, would HUD allow the HA to amend the existing contract from 105 to 104 units?

Dennis Crawford agreed to have K & S Contractors out to inspect the property and give 2 estimates, one to rehab and the other to rebuild.

Sue will contact Pam Breitenbach at HUD to discuss the options.

The Gloucester City Housing Authority has started the process with Crawford Law Firm by submitting a lawsuit against the contractor's insurance company.

Fire Panel Update: No final report regarding the diagnosis in response to the Fire Alarm failure has been received. Making daily calls to Independent Alarm for any updates.
